Dr. Rolston earned his medical and surgical degrees from the Christian Medical College - Ludhiana - Punjab University in Ludhiana, India. He then went on to complete his postgraduate training residency in internal medicine at the Franklin Square Hospital in Baltimore, MD followed by a clinical fellowship in infectious diseases at Hahnemann University Hospital in Philadelphia, PA. He is board certified in Internal Medicine with a subspecialty Boards in Infectious Disease.
