Hopkins, Jr., MD is Professor of Internal Medicine and Pediatrics and Director of the Internal Medicine-Pediatrics combined residency at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in Little Rock, AR. He is also the Director of Division of General Internal Medicine at the UAMS College of Medicine.

Dr. Hopkins received his Doctor of Medicine degree from the Medical College of Georgia in Augusta, GA and his undergraduate degree from Davidson College in Davidson, NC. He is board certified in internal medicine and pediatrics.

Dr. Hopkins currently serves as governor of the Arkansas Chapter of the American College of Physicians (ACP). He has also been involved in local and national efforts to improve preventive immunization through service on the Arkansas Department of Health Vaccine Medical Advisory Board, the ACP Adult Immunization Physician Advisory Board, and the Executive Committee of the National Influenza Vaccine Summit.
